What is the Idaho Telehealth Access Act?

The Idaho Telehealth Access Act is a new law that allows the practice and delivery of telehealth services in Idaho. As a result of the law, anyone can access a licensed doctor for simple, non-emergency medical conditions through their smart phone, tablet or computer.

Does the new law reinstate MDLIVE's services in Idaho? Why were MDLIVE's services suspended in the first place?

MDLIVE is pleased to announce that it will begin to provide consultations in the state of Idaho beginning June 1, 2015. Only Video Consultations will be provided.

MDLIVE's services were suspended in Idaho due to differing interpretations of state regulations governing telehealth consultations between the Idaho Board of Medicine and MDLIVE.
